Impact of the Pandemic and PB's Response

Engagement and communications with clients (domestic and international)

- Collaboration with stakeholders remained at the forefront
 - Offered various webinars and updated our web content and Frequently Asked Questions
- Continuous communication with IPIC, and international IP offices to ensure consistency

Rapid adaptation to maintain our services

- Ensured business continuity and a well functioning workforce with 99% of employees working remotely (transition of approx. 600 employees to full-time remote work)
- Quick change of pace equipped employees with proper IT tools and modified our processes and technologies
- Patent Law Treaty Addressed the inventory and learned many new processes
 - · e.g. recording transfers and changes of names

Impact of the Pandemic and PB's Response (Cont'd)

Employee engagement

- Employee commitment to maintain service delivery and operations
- Completed the training of two new cohorts of patent examiners remotely
- Hiring of 8 new patent examiners in Fall 2020 (Electrical and Mechanical Divisions)
- Ensured that the health and safety of our employees remained top priority

Operations - Updates

- Changed various other processes, services and technological supports
 - e.g. electronic signatures
- Changed various processes to allow more remote work at Incoming Correspondence Unit (ICU)
- Thin grant a new patent grant certificate and process developed to significantly reduce paper printing and processing
 - Currently working on having a single button download

Policy and International Affairs - Update

- Extensions under subsection 78(1) of the Patent Act in relation to designated days
 - Challenge with end date not known and anticipated sudden increase in volume
 - Hosted Information sessions explaining the various impacts of designated days
- Implemented a process for Accelerated Examination for Patent Applications related to COVID-19 Relief
- MOPOP revisions end of September 2020
 - Updates to office practices following PLT implementation
 - Updates to further clarify administrative procedures
