Drivers of this new brand normal?

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
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The <u>2018 Edelman Earned Brand</u> study shows that the market is being transformed by the rise of the Belief-Driven Buyer. Nearly two-thirds of consumers now choose, switch to or boycott a brand based on its stand on societal issues, up from 51 percent in 2017.

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Inauthenticity


We at [Brand] are committed to fighting injustice by posting images to Twitter that express our commitment to fighting injustice.

We hope this action encourages you to view [Brand] positively without, you know, expecting anything from us.




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

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
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- Artist's identity (trademark) v. artistic expression (copyright)

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Who is an Author?

- "To encourage learned *men* to write useful books" *Statute of Anne* 1710
- Copyright Act Lower Canada (1832), Province of Canada (1841) and Canada (1868): "...if the author, being dead, has left a widow..."




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Who is an Author?

- "From this it would almost seem as though the individual who has been dead and buried for some 1900 odd years and the plaintiff ought to be regarded as the joint authors and owners of the copyright, but inasmuch as I do not feel myself competent to make any declaration in his favour, and recognizing as I do that I have no jurisdiction extending to the sphere in which he moves, I think I ought to confine myself when inquiring who is the author to individuals who were alive when the work first came into existence..."

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


Who is an Author?

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ISED Statutory Review of *The Copyright Act* (2019)

"Our own legislation, perhaps informed by approaches taken in other jurisdictions, can be adapted to distinguish works made by humans with the help of Alsoftware from works created by AI without human intervention. The Committee therefore recommends:

Recommendation 14

That the Government of Canada consider amending the Copyright Act or introducing other legislation to provide clarity around the ownership of a computergenerated work."



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
