

#### Trademarks and Industrial Designs Branch (TIDB)

- Trademarks Branch amalgamated with the Copyright and Industrial Designs Branch.
- **Modernized** the Examiner training and development program.
- Adopted more **stringent hiring criteria** for Examiners.
- Successfully hired 38 new TM and ID Examiners. October 13 = 9 more. Total since 2018 is 66.
- Established **new quality procedures and processes** for TM and ID examination.




# A Year in Review Increased quality objectives in examination from 80% to 95% for ID and to 90% for TM. Suppanded list of possible telephone amendments with respect to TM applications. Since launching 183 files have been approved through telephone amendments. Canada's "Madrid filings" have exceeded expectations. Over 23,000 designations, and CIPO has certified more than 600 applications for international registration. Canada is ranked fourth place worldwide in terms of designations. Ingemented two specialized teams, including the Nice Team and the Madrid Team of Experts. Supplications. Angeue applications that stem from the Hague Agreement have been filed with CIPO in the past year. Canada is ranked 12<sup>th</sup> place worldwide in terms of Designs in international Registrations designating Canada.

## Quality and Timeliness during the Examination Process

- Current inventory of TM applications awaiting 1<sup>st</sup> action is 133,928.
- Pending TM mail currently stands at 9,392.
- Turnaround time (TAT) for TM 1<sup>st</sup> action is currently **23.7 months**.
- TAT for TM being approved is currently 29.4 months.
- TAT for TM correspondence is currently **2.6 months**.
- Current inventory of ID applications awaiting 1<sup>st</sup> action is **8,304**.
- Comparatively, TAT for ID 1<sup>st</sup> action currently stands at 11.1 months, and TAT for allowance is **13.5 months**.


#### **Conducting Pendency File Review**

- An internal review of TM files for which **four or more reports** had been previously issued.
- Review is an attempt to avoid piecemeal examination, increase quality and avoid sending superfluous reports.
- To date, of the 2855 files to review, feedback has been provided on **992 files (35%).**
- The new telephone amendments practice would be applicable in **20% of cases**.
- Piecemeal examination is an issue in 17% of cases.
- In **4% of cases**, a recommendation was made to withdraw a previously raised substantive objection.

#### COVID-19 Pandemic: Impact and TIDB's Response

- Implementation of Force Majeure provisions that extended most deadlines ending on or after March 16<sup>th</sup> to August 28<sup>th</sup> using a **period of designated days** under section 66 of the Trademarks Act and section 21 of the Industrial Design Act.
- CIPO has remained open for business from the outset of the pandemic.
- Heightened stakeholder relations at both the national and international level.
- Contributing to a COVID-19 operational dashboard on a weekly basis to monitor our progress.
- Implementation of a new short-term IT Modernization plan.



#### **Recent IT Improvements**

- Launched the **new general** eCorrespondence service.
- Significant improvements made to TM online services, including the TM database.
- Implemented automation in TM e-Filing and e-Renewal systems.
- Launched **new online services for ID** (E-Mailbox, E-Access, and E-Amendment).
- Streamlined the **ID registration package**.
- Introduced **new acknowledgement of receipt letter** for international registrations under the Hague Agreement.



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#### Looking Ahead: Expanded Telephone Amendments Practice

- Recently, TIDB **expanded the list of possible telephone amendments** with respect to TM applications.
- Purpose of the initiative is to provide examiners and clients with **more flexibility** in resolving minor issues on files by way of a telephone conversation.
- **Response is required within 72 hours**, as opposed to an examiner's report which gives clients 6 months to respond.
- Since being launched in May, 360 calls have been made by examiners, resulting in **183 approvals (51% of calls made)**.
- On average, examiners spend 7 minutes per call.
- 25% of calls have concerned files with one or two reports.
- Agent return call rate has been around 50%.

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#### Looking Ahead: Trademark Review Panel

- As a result of the pendency file review initiative, a **Trademarks Review Panel was established** on September 21<sup>st</sup> with the mandate of helping streamline the examination process.
- The initiative has been implemented with the hope of **alleviating some of the current correspondence burden**, shaping **more efficient examination practices**, and modelling **better examiner behaviour**.
- The **proposed four-member Panel** will be comprised of one employee from the Policy and Legislation directorate, one employee from the Quality and Continuous Development unit, a manager of Examination and one Examiner.
- Managers of Examination will submit applications to the Panel for review based on specific criteria.




#### Looking Ahead: Implementation of AI

- **Implementing an AI solution** to help facilitate and accelerate the grouping and classing of goods and services of registered trademarks according to the Nice Classification.
- Explore an AI based visual search tool for industrial designs, which provides automated ranking and ordering of all possible similar designs.



### Looking Ahead: Stakeholder Engagement

- Effective stakeholder engagement will continue to be a primary focus area
- Build upon the success of information sessions such as the National Information Sessions and pivot to virtual collaboration with stakeholders
- Continue holding quarterly meetings with TM and ID practice committees to discuss broader policy questions and office practices
- **Bolster international relationships** by liaising and coordinating discussions with leading IPOs and other international partners on best practices
